CHANGES TO CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

ADD 1-1 STATE PREVAILING WAGE RATES: Add the document entitled “*Missouri Division of Labor Standards – Annual Wage Order 22*,” attached to this Addendum.

CHANGES TO SPECIFICATIONS

ADD 1-2 SPECIFICATION SECTION 015000 – TEMPORARY FACILITIES AND CONTROLS:

A. Add new Paragraph 2.1, D. as follows:

- D. City's Representative/Construction Manager's Field Office: Provide separate prefabricated or mobile unit for exclusive use by the City's Representative/Construction Manager for the duration of the Contract. Size to accommodate the needs of the Owner, Architect and Construction Manager's office activities.

The office shall be in like-new condition, provided with at least 1 operable window with mini-blinds in the exterior wall of each occupied space. The windows and office doors shall be capable of being locked. The office shall have a plumbed, functional toilet facility complete with toilet and lavatory. Provide a mail slot in the main entrance door or a lockable mailbox mounted on the surface of the door. If the office is a trailer, it shall be securely anchored and provided with access steps at each entrance. Foundation/tie-downs must be provided. Furnish the field office as follows:

1. Field office shall contain 1 enclosed office appropriately sized to accommodate furnishings, but no smaller than 120 square feet in size. Provide electrical power service and 120-volt, ac duplex receptacles, with no fewer than 1 receptacle on each wall. Provide high-speed internet service and connection and furnish room with the following:
 - a. Plan table
 - b. Office desk with computer work space with ergonomically designed desk chair
 - c. 2-drawer horizontal file cabinet
 - d. 4-shelf bookcase (approximately 3 feet wide by 6 feet high by 12 inches deep)
 - e. 4-foot-square bulletin board
 - f. Wastebasket with supply of bags
 - g. Coat hooks or coat rack
2. Provide conference room area of sufficient size to accommodate furnishings and meetings of up to 6 individuals. Provide electrical power service and 120-volt, ac duplex receptacles with no fewer than 1 receptacle on each wall. Furnish room with the following:
 - a. Conference table and chairs
 - b. Plan table
 - c. 4-foot-square tack and marker boards
 - d. 4-foot-square bulletin board
 - e. Wastebasket with supply of bags

3. Bottled drinking water service with dispenser that dispenses cold and hot water.
4. Private toilet
5. Heating and cooling equipment necessary to maintain a uniform indoor temperature of 68 to 72 degrees F.
6. Lighting fixtures capable of maintaining average illumination of 20 footcandles at desk height.
7. First aid kit including, at a minimum, antiseptic kit, eyewash solution, bandages, insect sting medications, aspirin and acetaminophen, and cold packs.
8. Minimum 2.5 cu. ft. refrigerator with freezer compartment.
9. Provide a 4-foot-long countertop and base cabinet.
10. Provide daily janitorial services and as-needed trailer maintenance services. Daily janitorial services shall include, but not be limited to, sweeping, trash removal, as-needed emptying/servicing of toilets, weekly mopping of floors, sanitizing toilet seats, providing towels and soap to the lavatories and toilet tissue as needed, and monthly washing of floors and windows (inside and out). The time of cleaning shall be coordinated with the City's Representative/ Construction Manager.

ADD 1-3 SPECIFICATION SECTION 03 30 00 – CAST-IN-PLACE CONCRETE:

A. Revise paragraphs 2.6,C. and D. to read as follows:

C. Dosage Rates:

1. Fiber reinforcing shall be required for the building slab-on-grade in accordance with the Structural General Notes of the Drawings. Dosage rate shall be a minimum of 5 pounds fiber reinforcement per cubic yard of concrete.
2. For site concrete, fiber reinforcing shall be required where indicated on the Drawings. Dosage rate shall be 1.5 pounds fiber reinforcement per cubic yard of concrete.

D. Mixing:

1. For building slab-on-grade, fibers shall be mixed in accordance with the Structural General Notes of the Drawings. Fibers shall be added at the site and mixed with the truck mixer until the fibers are thoroughly integrated into the concrete mixture.
2. For site concrete, fibers shall be added at the batch plant.

ADD 1-4 SPECIFICATION SECTION 125500 – DETENTION FURNITURE:

A. Revise paragraph 2.1,A.,1. to read as follows (*retain product subparagraphs*):

1. Products: Subject to compliance with requirements, available products that may be incorporated into the Work include, but are not limited to, the following:

B. Delete subparagraph 2.2,C.,1., “*Power Output Ratings: Nominal standby rating of 1250 kW.*” Reference Drawings and information contained in this Addendum for correct generator size.

C. Delete subparagraph 2.4,B.,2., “*Capacity: Fuel for 72 hours’ continuous operation at 100 percent rated power output.*” Reference Drawings and information contained in this Addendum for correct generator fuel storage requirements.

ADD 1-8 SHEET C103 – SITE PLAN DETAILS: Replace the existing Sheet C103 in its entirety with the attached Sheet C103, revision date March 2, 2016. Island/Area 6 reflects revisions to the dumpster enclosure.

ADD 1-9 SHEET C105 – GRADING PLAN: Replace the existing Sheet C105 in its entirety with the attached Sheet C105, revision date March 2, 2016. This Sheet reflects revisions to the dumpster enclosure.

ADD 1-10 SHEET C106 – GRADING PLAN DETAILS: Replace the existing Sheet C106 in its entirety with the attached Sheet C106, revision date March 2, 2016. Island/Area 6 reflects revisions to the dumpster enclosure.

 - C. In the LIGHT FIXTURE SCHEDULE, Fixture Type H1, add Scott Architectural Lighting, Model S2017-8C39T as an acceptable alternative fixture in lieu of the Shaper Lighting model specified.

- ADD 1-18 PREBID MEETING: A prebid meeting was held on February 23, 2016, at the Joplin Regional Airport. Meeting minutes from the prebid meeting, including meeting agenda and attendee sign-in sheet, are attached to this Addendum.

ADD 1-19 PRODUCT SUBSTITUTION REQUEST FORM: Substitution requests shall be submitted to the Architect using the “Product Substitution Request” form attached to this Addendum. Bidder shall follow the procedures outlined in Section 012500 SUBSTITUTION PROCEDURES.

ADD 1-20 GENERAL NOTICE ABOUT PRODUCT SUBSTITUTION REQUESTS: Product substitution requests that have been received by the Architect which did not use the correct Product Substitution Request form (Reference Addendum Item ADD 1-19 above) are not addressed in this Addendum. Product substitution requests submitted on the appropriate form and including the necessary product data must be received by the Architect a minimum of 5 calendar days prior to receipt of Bids.

ADD 1-21 PRODUCT SUBSTITUTION REQUESTS:

- A. Product Substitution Request for paragraph 2.1,B. in Section 072100 – Thermal Insulation, attached to this Addendum, is not accepted.
- B. Product Substitution Request 083463 – Detention Doors and Frames, attached to this Addendum, is Accepted as Noted. Product must comply with all requirements of the Drawings and Specifications.
- C. Product Substitution Request for Section 102239 – Folding Panel Partitions (Operable Partitions), attached to this Addendum, is Accepted as Noted. Product must comply with all requirements of the Drawings and Specifications.
- D. Product Substitution Request for Section 111916 – Detention Gun Lockers as attached to this Addendum is Accepted as Noted. Product must comply with all requirements of the Drawings and Specifications.
- E. Product Substitution Request for Section 125500 – Detention Furniture, attached to this Addendum, is Accepted as Noted. Product must comply with all requirements of the Drawings and Specifications.

ADD 1-22 BIDDER QUESTIONS:

A. Questions:

- “1. Fiber mesh: Section 03 30 00-5 specs 1.5 lbs per yard, Drawing S002 concrete reinforcing 4.A says 5 lbs per yd?
- 2. Dumpster pad Civil Drawing shows 22’x16’ in size, Arch. show 20’8” x 13’ in size? Need slab thickness, subbase, bollards, and the reinforcing for slab.
- 3 Concrete flume on C110 saw joints? Expansion joints? Joints caulked? Subbase?
- 4. Alt 2 says to add sidewalks per legend. So no sidewalks in Base Bid there?”

Answers:

1. Reference Addendum Item ADD 1-3 above.
2. Drawings have been revised to clarify the dumpster enclosure and are attached to this Addendum. Reference the applicable Addendum items listed under the “CHANGES TO DRAWINGS” section above. Per the Civil Drawings, pavement within the enclosure shall be heavy-duty concrete pavement (reference Sheet C110).
3. Reference Addendum Items ADD 1-12 and ADD 1-13 above for revised Sheets C110 and C111, which are attached to this Addendum.
4. Reference Civil Sheets C102 and C104 for the location of the sidewalk in the Base Bid versus Add Alternate 2.

- B. Question: *“I am not seeing the wage rate scale in the Specification book. I realize it is prevailing wage, but need it identified so we are clear.”*

Answer: Refer to Addendum Item ADD 1-1 above and the document attached to this Addendum entitled “Missouri Division of Labor Standards – Annual Wage Order 22.”

- C. Question: A question was asked whether the requirement for AISC plant certification for steel manufacturer may be waived.

Answer: AISC plant certification will not be waived for this Project.

- D. Question: *“I was wondering if the Type 1 curb and gutter detail as shown on page C110 of the Plans had any flexibility on the design...the face of curb and the gutter show a 2½-inch radius, which I haven’t seen this design used before around the area...” “Also, I cannot find anywhere on the Plans where the curb flumes will be used.”*

Answer: Reference Addendum Item ADD 1-12 above. The Engineer will consider alternate curb face profiles. The curb flume is utilized at the back of Island 13. Reference Sheets C103 and C106.

- E. Question: *“On Sheet E105, what is the symbol for with filled data triangle and “F” letter (located at the fire panel and remote annunciator)? Is this part of the fire alarm even though not shown on the Special Systems Plan E107? Is it only to communicate between panel and annunciator?”*

Answer: The fire alarm control panel requires 2 separate telephone phone lines, per the Specifications. The filled triangle symbol with the letter F next to the remote annunciator panel is not required and should be omitted. Telephone communication is required at the FACP. Communication link between FACP and annunciator is required as part of the fire alarm system to be completely operational. Wiring of the fire alarm system components is the responsibility of the fire alarm contractor and is not indicated in the Documents.

- F. Question: *“The signaling devices specified are audio/visual and not speaker/visual, so I assume the system is not mass notification, only fire alarm. Is that correct?”*

Answer: Mass notification is not required for this facility and is not included in the scope of Work.

- G. Question: *“The one-line on E401 shows the generator as 100 kW with a 400-amp transfer switch; however, the Generator Schedule on E601 shows an 83 kW generator with a 250-amp ATS shown in the schedule.”*

Answer: The one-line diagram on Sheet E401 is correct; the generator is 100 kW and the automatic transfer switch is 400 amps. These schedules are revised as part of this Addendum.

- H. Question: *“Light Fixture Type C4 shows up in Def. TAC. Storage Room 116 on Sheet E104, but is not identified in the fixture schedule on Sheet E601.”*

Answer: Type C4 does not exist, and the fixtures are mislabeled. The fixtures in Storage Room 116 shall be Type C2.

- I. Question: A question was asked by an attendee at the prebid meeting held on February 23, 2016, about whether there is a preference to local Contractors.

Answer: The initial response given at the prebid meeting was incorrect due to a misunderstanding of the question. Preferences to vendors or contractors shall be according to “Council Bill 2008-020,” attached to this Addendum.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION OVERTIME SCHEDULE**

FED: Minimum requirement per Fair Labor Standards Act means time and one-half (1 ½) shall be paid for all work in excess of forty (40) hours per work week.

NO. 4: Means the regular working day shall consist of eight (8) hours labor on the job between six (6) a.m. and six-thirty (6:30) p.m. and the regular working week shall consist of five (5) consecutive eight (8) hour days beginning with Monday and ending with Friday of each week. All full time or part time labor performed during such hours shall be recognized as regular working hours and paid for at the regular hourly rate. All work performed outside the regular working hours and performed during the regular work week and Saturday work, shall be paid at one & one-half (1½) times the regular rate. All recognized holidays or days locally observed as such, and Sundays shall be paid at the double (2) time rate of pay. Also, there may be a 40-hour work week which would consist of ten (10) hours each day for Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday.

NO. 6: Means eight (8) hours shall constitute a standard work day, and forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a week's work. All time worked outside of the standard work day and on Saturday shall be classified as overtime and paid the rate of time and one-half (1½). All work done on Sunday and recognized holidays must be paid for at the double (2) time rate. The Employer shall have the option of working five (5) eight (8) hour days or four (4) ten (10) hour days to constitute a normal forty (40) hour work week. Work in excess of eight (8) hours per day (when working 5-8's) or ten (10) hours per day (when working 4-10's) or forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at the overtime rate of time and one-half (1½). When the four (4) day ten (10) hour work week is in effect, the standard work week shall consist of forty (40) hours, Monday through Friday, which will consist of any four (4) ten (10) hour days within the five (5) day period. In the event the job is down for any reason beyond the control of the Employer, then Friday and/or Saturday may, at the option of the Employer, be worked as a make-up day, straight time not to exceed ten (10) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week. Starting time will be designated by the Employer. When the five (5) day eight (8) hour work week is in effect, forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a week's work, normal work week being Monday through Friday. In the event the job is down for any reason beyond the control of the Employer, then Saturday may, at the option of the Employer, be worked as a make-up day at straight time not to exceed eight (8) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week. In instances where work days are lost due to circumstances beyond the Contractor's control, make-up days may be used. Scheduling conflicts are not valid reasons. Make-up days are not to be used to make up lost time due to recognized holidays.

NO. 7: Means work between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. daily, Monday through Saturday, as assigned by the Employer shall be considered regular hours. Weekend work shall be paid at the rate of one and one-half (1 ½) times the regular rate of pay. Weekend begins 12:01a.m. Saturday. Overtime is time worked over forty (40) hours per pay period, and shall be paid at the rate of one and one-half (1½) times the regular rate of pay. Sunday and Holidays will be paid at the rate of two (2) times the regular rate of pay.

NO. 10: Means the regular working day shall be scheduled to consist of at least eight (8) hours but no more than ten (10) consecutive hours, exclusive of the lunch period, unless otherwise provided. Crews shall be scheduled to commence at any time between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. or earlier if agreed on by the majority of any one crew. Except as specifically provided for Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, all work performed by Employees anywhere in excess of forty (40) hours in one (1) work week, or in excess of ten (10) hours in one work day shall be paid at the rate of one and one-half (1½) times the regular hourly wage scale. Any work performed on a Saturday shall be paid at the rate of one and one-half (1½) times the regular hourly wage scale unless such Saturday work falls under the category of Saturday make Up Day. When this Saturday Make Up Day does occur, the Employee may work on Saturday at straight time; provided, however, if during the period worked by said Employee on Saturday, the Employee's compensable time at the straight time rate exceeds forty (40) hours, all time worked in excess of the forty (40) hours will be paid at the rate of one and one-half (1½) time the regular hourly wage scale. The provision of this Saturday Make Up Day shall not apply to any weeks in which a designated holiday is recognized. Any work performed by Employees anywhere on Sunday or holidays shall be paid at the rate of double (2) time the regular wage scale.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION OVERTIME SCHEDULE**

NO. 19: On single shift operation, eight (8) hours of work, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., shall constitute a day's work. Forty (40) hours of work Monday through Friday shall constitute a workweek. The starting time may be changed to begin between the hours of six (6:00) and ten (10:00) a.m. The first two (2) hours performed in excess of an eight (8) hour workday Monday through Friday, and the first ten (10) hours on Saturday, shall be paid at time and one-half (1.5) the basic straight-time rate. All work performed on Sundays and holidays, and in excess of ten (10) hours a day shall be paid at double (2) the basic straight time rate of pay. When hours worked are outside of established work hours, the pay rate shall be one and one-half (1.5) times the regular rate of pay for the first ten (10) hours, and all hours in excess of ten (10) hours shall be at the double-time rate. Shift work of either one (1) eight hour night shift, or two (2) eight (8) hour night shifts on a job which will continue for at least one (1) week, all employees shall be paid eighteen and one-half percent (18.5%) over the straight-time hourly rate on the night shifts. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) in a shift shall be paid at the applicable overtime rate of pay. The normal workweek may be changed to four (4) ten (10) hour days or four (4) ten (10) hour nights, if on shift work, with the following provisions: Monday through Thursday would be the normal workweek with Friday being used as scheduled workday in case of a day being lost due to weather, all employees working night shift, on a job that will continue at least one (1) week, shall be paid thirty percent (30%) over the regular straight-time hourly rate of pay, and any hours worked before or after established starting and quitting times being paid at double (2) time hourly rates of pay.

NO. 24: Means eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work on all classes of work between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The pay for time worked during these hours shall be at the regular wage rate. The regular workweek shall be Monday through Friday. A workweek of four (4), ten (10) hour days may be established on a per job basis. Saturday may be used for a make-up day, when working 5-8's, Friday when working 4-10's. All time worked before and after the established workday of eight (8) hours, Monday through Friday, and all time worked on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half (1½) except after eight (8) hours worked, then double (2) time will apply. All time worked on Sundays and the recognized holidays shall be paid at the rate of double (2) time.

NO. 26: Means that the regular working day shall consist of eight (8) hours worked between 6:00 a.m., and 5:00 p.m., five (5) days per week, Monday to Friday, inclusive. Hours of work at each jobsite shall be those established by the general contractor and worked by the majority of trades. (The above working hours may be changed by mutual agreement). Work performed on Construction Work on Saturdays, Sundays and before and after the regular working day on Monday to Friday, inclusive, shall be classified as overtime, and paid for at double (2) the rate of single time. The employer may establish hours worked on a jobsite for a four (4) ten (10) hour day work week at straight time pay for construction work; the regular working day shall consist of ten (10) hours worked consecutively, between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., four (4) days per week, Monday to Thursday, inclusive. Any work performed on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and holidays, and before and after the regular working day on Monday to Thursday where a four (4) ten (10) hour day workweek has been established, will be paid at two times (2) the single time rate of pay. The rate of pay for all work performed on holidays shall be at two times (2) the single time rate of pay.

NO. 27: Means eight (8) hours of work between the hours of eight (8:00) a.m. and four-thirty (4:30) p.m., shall constitute a work day. Forty (40) hours within five (5) days - Monday through Friday, inclusive - shall constitute a work week. The regular starting time in the morning may be moved not more than one hour prior to 8:00 a.m.; however, in no case shall more than eight (8) hours be worked per day without the applicable overtime rate being paid. When job conditions dictate and as required by the employer, the employer shall be allowed to establish a four (4) day, ten (10) hour per day work week. This work week is defined as Monday through Thursday, with a Friday make-up day. The normal work day under a ten (10) hour four (4) day work week shall be from 8:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., with a one hour starting variance. The make-up day of Friday shall be instituted for specific reasons such as loss of production due to weather and Holidays. All hours worked in excess of ten (10) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week or hours worked outside the normal work week shall be paid at the applicable overtime rate. This language is not intended to change the normal five (5) day, eight (8) hours per day work week. All overtime work after a regular work day, (8) hours, Monday through Friday shall be paid at time and one-half (1½). All hours worked on Saturday shall be paid at time and one-half (1½). All other overtime on Sunday and recognized holidays shall be paid for at double (2) the straight-time rate of pay. Shift work performed between the hours of 4:30 p.m. and 1:00 a.m. (second shift) shall receive eight (8) hours pay at the regular hourly rate of pay plus 17.3% for all hours worked. Shift work performed between the hours of 12:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. (third shift) shall receive eight (8) hours pay at the regular hourly rate of pay plus 31.4% for all hours worked. A lunch period of thirty (30) minutes shall be allowed on each shift. All overtime work required after the completion of a regular shift shall be paid at one and one-half (1½) times the shift hourly rate.

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NO. 29: Means eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work and shall be from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Starting time may be advanced or delayed by the employer up to two (2) hours from the regular starting time. Any hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours shall be paid for at one and one-half (1½) times the regular rate of pay. The employer may establish a 4-10's schedule on projects (4 days with 10 hours per day). If using a 4-10's schedule, a Friday make-up day is allowed. If using a 4-10's schedule, any work more than ten (10) hours in a day or forty (40) hours in a work week shall be paid at the time and one-half (1½) rate. Friday make-up days shall not be used to make up for time lost due to recognized holidays. All hours worked between 4:30 p.m. Friday and 4:30 p.m. Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half. All hours worked from 4:30 p.m. Saturday until 8:00 a.m. Monday and all holidays shall be paid for at double (2) the regular rate of pay. Employees failing to work a regular forty (40) hour week due to inclement weather may work on Saturday at the regular rate of pay.

NO. 31: Means a regular work week shall consist of not more than forty (40) hours of work and all work performed over and above ten (10) hours per day and forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at the rate of time and one-half (1½). A workday is to begin between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. at the option of the Employer except when inclement weather or other conditions beyond the reasonable control of the Employer, in which event, the starting time may be advanced or delayed. Work performed on recognized holidays or days observed as such, shall receive time and one-half (1½).

NO. 33: Means the standard work day and week shall be eight (8) consecutive hours of work between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., excluding the lunch period Monday through Friday, or shall conform to the practice on the job site. Four (4) days at ten (10) hours a day may be worked at straight time, Monday through Friday and need not be consecutive. All overtime, except for Sundays and holidays shall be at the rate of time and one-half (1½). Overtime worked on Sundays and holidays shall be at double (2) time.

NO. 36: Means eight (8) hours shall constitute a work day, Monday through Friday between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Saturday can be used as a makeup day if time is lost due to weather. All hours in excess of the regular forty (40) hour work week or eight (8) hours per day shall be considered overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of one and one-half (1½) times the regular rate. Employees will be paid at the rate of one and one-half (1½) times their regular rate for work performed on Saturdays. Sundays and holidays worked are to be paid at double (2) the regular hourly rate. Four (4) ten-hour days, at the option of the Employer, shall be the standard work week, consisting of a consecutive ten-hour period, Monday through Thursday or Tuesday through Friday, between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a week's work.

NO. 48: Means the regularly scheduled work week shall be five (5) consecutive days, Monday through Friday or Tuesday through Saturday. Eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work. Starting time shall not be earlier than 7:00 a.m. nor later than 10:00 a.m. Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work. Overtime at the rate of time and one-half (1½) will be paid for all work in excess of forty (40) hours in any one work week. On the Monday through Friday schedule, all work performed on Saturday will be time and one-half (1½) unless time has been lost during the week, in which case Saturday will be a make up day to the extent of the lost time. On the Tuesday through Saturday schedule, all work performed on Monday will be time and one-half (1½) unless time has been lost during the week, in which case Monday will be a make-up day to the extent of the lost time. Any work performed on Sunday will be double (2) time. If employees work on any of the recognized holidays, they shall be paid time and one-half (1½) their regular rate of pay for all hours worked.

NO. 50: Means eight (8) hours constitute a normal day's work Monday through Friday. Any time worked over eight (8) hours will normally be paid at time and one-half (1½) except for exclusions stated in some following additional sentences. The Employer, at his discretion, may start the work day between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Any schedule chosen shall be started at the beginning of the work week (Monday) and used for at least five days. Work may be scheduled on a four (4) days a week (Monday through Thursday) at ten (10) hours a day schedule. If such a schedule is employed, then Friday may be used as a make-up day when time is lost due to inclement weather. Time and one-half (1½) shall be paid for any work in excess of eight (8) hours in any regular work day Monday through Friday unless working 4-10's, then time and one-half (1½) after ten (10) hours. All work performed on Saturday will be time and one-half (1½). Double (2) time shall be paid for all work on Sundays and recognized holidays.

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NO 56: Means the regular work day shall consist of eight (8) hours between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. An optional four day work week may be utilized with the ten (10) hour clause, days Monday through Thursday or Tuesday through Friday. Work hours shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. any work performed on Monday or Friday outside the regular scheduled four (4) days shall be at one and one half (1 ½) the regular rate of pay. Work performed outside of the regular work day, and on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one half (1 ½) the regular rate of pay. Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double (2) time the regular rate of pay.

NO. 57: Means eight (8) hours per day shall constitute a day's work and forty (40) hours per week, Monday through Friday, shall constitute a week's work. The regular starting time shall be 8:00 a.m. If a second or third shift is used, the regular starting time of the second shift shall be 4:30 p.m. and the regular starting period for the third shift shall be 12:30 a.m. These times may be adjusted by the employer. The day shift shall work a regular eight (8) hours shift as outlined above. Employees working a second shift shall receive an additional \$0.25 above the regular hourly rate and perform seven and one-half (7½) hours work for eight (8) hours pay. Third shift employees shall be paid an additional \$0.50 above the regular hourly rate and work seven (7) hours for eight (8) hours pay. When circumstances warrant, the Employer may change the regular workweek to four (4) ten-hour days at the regular time rate of pay. All time worked before and after the established workday of eight (8) hours, Monday through Friday, and all time worked on Saturday shall be paid at the rate of time and one-half (1½) except in cases where work is part of an employee's regular Friday shift. All time worked on Sunday and recognized holidays shall be paid at the double (2) time rate of pay except in cases where work is part of an employee's previous day's shift. For all overtime hours worked \$25.65 of the fringe benefits portion of the prevailing wage shall be paid at the same overtime rate at which the cash portion of the prevailing wage is to be paid. The remaining \$1.29 of the fringe benefit portion of the prevailing wage may be paid at straight time.

NO. 64: Means eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work beginning at 8:00 a.m. and ending at 4:30 p.m. Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work, Sunday through Saturday. In the event time is lost due to weather or conditions beyond the control of the Employer, the Employer may schedule work on Saturday at straight time. All work over eight (8) hours in one day, forty (40) hours in one week, or on Saturday (except as herein provided) shall be classified as overtime and be paid at the rate of time and one-half (1½). All work on Sunday or recognized holidays shall be classified as overtime and be paid at the rate of double (2) time. When the four (4) day ten-hour work week is in effect, the standard work day shall be consecutive ten (10) hour periods. Forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a week's work Sunday through Saturday inclusive. In the event the job is down for reasons beyond the contractors control, then Friday and/or Saturday may, at the option of the Employer be worked as a make-up day, straight time not to exceed ten (10) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week.

NO. 84: The regular working starting time of 8:00 a.m. (and resulting quitting time of 4:30 p.m.) may be moved forward to 6:00 a.m. or delayed one (1) hour to 9:00 a.m. Except as provided in this Article, eight (8) hours a day shall constitute a standard work day and forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a weeks' work, which shall begin on Sunday and end on Saturday. All time worked outside of the standard work day and on Saturday shall be classified as overtime and paid at the rate of time & one-half (1½) (except as herein provided). All time worked on Sunday and recognized holidays shall be classified as overtime and paid at the rate of double (2) time. The Employer has the option of working either five (5) eight-hour days or four (4) ten-hour days to constitute a normal forty (40) hour work week. When the four (4) ten-hour work week is in effect, the standard work day shall be consecutive ten (10) hour periods, exclusive of the lunch period, beginning at 6:30 a.m. and forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a week's work, Monday through Thursday, inclusive. In the event the job is down for any reason beyond the Employer's control, then Friday and/or Saturday may, at the option of the Employer, be worked as a make-up day, straight time not to exceed ten (10) hours or forty (40) hours per week. When the five (5) eight-hour work week is in effect, forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a week's work, Monday through Friday, inclusive. In the event the job is down for any reason beyond the Employer's control, then Saturday may, at the option of the Employer, be worked as a make-up day, straight time not to exceed eight (8) hours or forty (40) hours per week.

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NO. 123: Means except as provided, eight (8) hours a day (8:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M.) shall constitute a standard work day, excluding the 30-minute lunch period, and forty (40) hours per week shall constitute a week's work. All time worked outside of the standard work day and on Saturday shall be classified as overtime and paid the rate of time and one-half (except as herein provided). All time worked on Sunday and herein named holidays shall be classified as overtime and paid at the rate of double time. The Employer has the option of working either five (5) eight-hour days or four (4) ten-hour days to constitute a normal forty (40) hour work week. When the four (4) day ten-hour work week is in effect, the standard work week shall consist of forty (40) hours, Monday through Friday, which will consist of any four (4) consecutive ten (10) hour days within the five day period. In the event the job is down for any reason beyond the control of the Employer, then Friday and/or Saturday may, at the option of the Employer, be worked as a make-up day, straight time not to exceed ten (10) hours or forty (40) hours per week. Starting time will be designated by the Employer. When the five (5) day eight (8) hour work week is in effect forty (40) hours per week will constitute a week's work (normal work week being Monday through Friday). In the event the job is down for any reason beyond the control of the Employer, then Saturday may, at the option of the Employer, be worked as a make-up day; at straight time not to exceed eight (8) hours or forty (40) hours per week.

NO. 124: Means eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work on all classes of work between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The pay for time worked during these hours shall be at the regular wage rate. The regular workweek shall be Monday through Friday. Employment from 4:30 p.m. to 12:00 midnight, Monday through Friday, shall be paid for at one and one-half (1½) times the regular hourly rate. From 12:00 midnight until 8:00 a.m. on any day shall be paid for at twice the regular hourly rate. All time worked on Sundays and the recognized holidays shall be paid at the rate of double (2) time. It is understood that forty (40) hours shall constitute a regular workweek, (5-8's) Sunday Midnight through Friday Midnight, understanding anything over eight (8) hours is one and one-half (1½) times the hourly wage rate.

NO. 125: Eight (8) hours of work between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. shall constitute a work day. Forty (40) hours within the five (5) days, Monday through Friday inclusive, shall constitute the work week. Starting time may be adjusted not to exceed two (2) hours. Work performed outside of the aforementioned will be paid at the applicable overtime rate. When starting time has been adjusted, all other provisions concerning the work day shall be adjusted accordingly. The overtime rate of pay shall be one and one-half (1½) times the regular rate of wages, other than on Sundays, holidays and from Midnight until 6:00 a.m., which will be paid at double (2) the straight time rate.

JASPER COUNTY HOLIDAY SCHEDULE – BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

NO. 1: All work done on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day shall be paid at the rate of double time. When one of the above holidays falls on Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed. When one of the above holidays falls on Saturday the preceding Friday shall be observed.

NO. 2: All work performed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, or the days observed as such, shall be paid at the double time rate of pay.

NO. 4: All work done on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day shall be paid at the double time rate of pay. If any of the above holidays fall on Sunday, Monday will be observed as the recognized holiday. If any of the above holidays fall on Saturday, Friday will be observed as the recognized holiday.

NO. 7: The following days are assigned days and are recognized as holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. If a holiday falls on a Sunday, it shall be observed on the following Monday. If a holiday falls on a Saturday, it shall be observed on the preceding Friday. No work shall be performed on Labor Day except in case of jeopardy to work under construction. This is applied to protect Labor Day. When a holiday falls during the normal workweek, Monday through Friday, it shall be counted as eight (8) hours toward the forty (40) hour week. However, no reimbursement for these eight (8) hours is to be paid to the workman unless worked. If workman are required to work the above enumerated holidays or days observed as such, or on Sunday, they shall receive double (2) the regular rate of pay for such work.

NO. 9: All work performed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day shall be paid for at the double time rate of pay. Any one of the above listed holidays falling on Sunday shall be observed on the following Monday and paid at the double time rate of pay as all observed holidays, if worked.

NO. 14: The following days are recognized Holidays: Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. No work shall be done on Labor Day. When falling on a Sunday and the following Monday is observed as part of the holiday, then that Monday shall be considered a holiday. Sunday and Holidays will be paid at the rate of two (2) times the regular rate of pay.

NO. 19: All work done on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day shall be paid at the double time rate of pay. The employee may take off Friday following Thanksgiving Day. However, the employee shall notify his or her Foreman, General Foreman or Superintendent on the Wednesday preceding Thanksgiving Day. When one of the above holidays falls on Sunday, the following Monday shall be considered a holiday and all work performed on either day shall be at the double (2) time rate. When one of the holidays falls on Saturday, the preceding Friday shall be considered a holiday and all work performed on either day shall be at the double (2) time rate.

NO. 24: All work done on Christmas Day, Thanksgiving Day, New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Presidential Election Day or days locally observed as such, and Sunday shall be recognized as holidays and paid at the double time rate of pay.

NO. 28: All work done on New Year's Day, Veteran's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day shall be paid at the double time rate of pay. No work shall be performed on Labor Day except when triple (3) time is paid. When a holiday falls on Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed as the holiday.

JASPER COUNTY HOLIDAY SCHEDULE – BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

NO. 35: The following days are recognized as holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If a holiday falls on a Sunday, it shall be observed on the following Monday. No work shall be performed on Labor Day except in case of jeopardy to work under construction. This rule is applied to protect Labor Day. When a holiday falls during the normal work week, Monday through Friday, it shall be counted as eight (8) hours toward the forty (40) hour week; however, no reimbursement for this eight (8) hours is to be paid the workman unless worked. An Employer working a four (4) day, ten (10) hour schedule may use Friday as a make-up day when an observed holiday occurs during the work week. Employees have the option to work that make-up day. If workmen are required to work the above enumerated holidays or days observed as such, they shall receive time and one-half (1 ½) the regular rate of pay for such work.

NO. 49: The following days shall be observed as legal holidays: New Year's Day, Decoration Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, Employee's birthday and two (2) personal days. The observance of one (1) of the personal days to be limited to the time between December 1 and March 1 of the following year. If any of these holidays fall on Sunday, the following Monday will be observed as the holiday and if any of these holidays fall on Saturday, the preceding Friday will be observed as the holiday. If employees work on any of these holidays they shall be paid time & one-half (1½) their regular rate of pay for all hours worked.

NO. 52: All work performed on Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day shall receive the double (2) time rate of pay.

NO. 54: All work performed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, the Friday after Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day shall be paid at the double (2) time rate of pay. When a holiday falls on Saturday, it shall be observed on Friday. When a holiday falls on Sunday, it shall be observed on Monday.

NO. 63: All work done on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day must be paid for at the double (2) time rate. No work shall be done on Labor Day or the Fourth of July except to preserve life or property. When any of the above named holidays fall on Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed as such holiday. If they fall on Saturday, Friday shall be observed as the holiday.

NO. 64: All work performed on New Year's Day, Decoration Day (Memorial Day), Independence Day (Fourth of July), Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day shall be paid for at double (2) the regular rate of pay. When any of the above named holidays shall fall on Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed as such holiday. If any other craft is afforded a provision of observing Friday as the holiday when the holiday falls on Saturday, Laborers shall be granted the same provision. If another craft that Laborers are tending recognize a specific holiday that Laborers do not normally recognize, the Laborers tending that craft shall recognize the same holiday.

NO. 65: Work performed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, or days celebrated as such, shall be paid at the double time rate of pay. If the holiday falls on Saturday, it will be observed on Friday; if the holiday falls on Sunday, it will be observed on Monday, and shall be paid for at double (2) the regular straight time rate of pay.

NO. 74: All work performed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, shall be paid at double (2) time of the hourly rate of pay. In the event one of the above holiday's falls on Saturday, the holiday shall be celebrated on Saturday. If the holiday falls on Sunday, the holiday will be celebrated on Monday.

NO. 78: The following days shall be recognized as holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. If any of the above holidays fall on Sunday, Monday will be observed as the legal holiday. If any of the above holidays fall on Saturday, Friday will be observed as the legal holiday. All time worked on Sunday and herein named holidays shall be classified as overtime and paid at the rate of double time.

Use Building Construction Rates on Building construction in accordance with the classifications of construction work established in 8 CSR 30-3.040(2).

If a worker is performing work on a heavy construction project within an occupational title that is not listed on the Heavy Construction Rate Sheet, use the rate for that occupational title as shown on the Building Construction Rate sheet.

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FED: Minimum requirement per Fair Labor Standards Act means time and one-half (1 ½) shall be paid for all work in excess of forty (40) hours per work week.

NO. 4: Means a regular work week shall consist of not more than forty (40) hours of work, Monday through Saturday, and all work performed over and above ten (10) hours per day and forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at the rate of time & one-half (1½). Workers shall receive time and one-half (1½) for all work performed on Sundays and holidays. A work day is to begin between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. at the option of the Employer except when inclement weather or other conditions beyond the reasonable control of the Employer prevent work, in which event, the starting time may be delayed, but not later than 12:00 noon. When a holiday falls during the normal work week, Monday through Friday, it shall be counted as eight (8) hours toward a forty (40) hour week; however, no reimbursement for this eight (8) hours is to be paid to the worker(s) unless worked.

NO. 5: Means a regular work week shall consist of not more than forty (40) hours work, Monday through Saturday, and all work performed over and above ten (10) hours per day and forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at the rate of time & one-half (1½). Workmen shall receive time and one-half (1½) for all work performed on Sundays and recognized holidays or days observed as such. Double (2) time shall be paid for work on Sunday or recognized holidays when and only if any other craft employees of the same employer at work on that same job site are receiving double (2) time pay for that Sunday or holiday. If a job can't work forty (40) hours, Monday through Saturday, because of inclement weather or other conditions beyond the control of the Employer, Friday and Saturday may be worked as make up days at straight time (if working 4-10's). Saturday may be worked as a make up day at straight time (if working 5-8's). Make up days shall not be utilized for days lost to holidays. A work day is to begin between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. at the option of the Employer except when inclement weather or other conditions beyond the reasonable control of the Employer, including requirements of the owner, prevent work. In such event the starting time may be delayed but not later than 12:00 noon. Where one of the holidays falls or is observed during the work week, then all work performed over and above thirty-two (32) hours shall be paid at time & one-half (1½).

NO. 12: Means a regular work week shall consist of not more than forty (40) hours of work and all work performed over and above ten (10) hours per day and forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at the rate of time & one-half (1½). A workday is to begin between 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. at the option of the Employer except when inclement weather or other conditions beyond the reasonable control of the Employer, in which event, the starting time may be advanced or delayed. Workers shall receive time and one-half (1½) for all work performed on recognized holidays or days observed as such.

NO: 18: Eight (8) hours of work between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. shall constitute a work day. Forty (40) hours within the five (5) days, Monday through Friday inclusive, shall constitute the work week. Starting time may be adjusted not to exceed two (2) hours. Work performed outside of the aforementioned will be paid at the applicable overtime rate. When starting time has been adjusted, all other provisions concerning the work day shall be adjusted accordingly. The overtime rate of pay shall be one and one-half (1½) times the regular rate of wages, other than on Sundays, holidays and from Midnight until 6:00 a.m., which will be paid at double (2) the straight time rate.

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JASPER COUNTY
OVERTIME SCHEDULE - HEAVY CONSTRUCTION**

NO. 23: Means the regular workweek shall start on Monday and end on Friday, except where the Employer elects to work Monday through Thursday, (10) hours per day. All work over ten (10) hours in a day or forty (40) hours in a week shall be at the overtime rate of one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) times the regular hourly rate. The regular workday shall be either eight (8) or ten (10) hours. If a job can't work forty (40) hours Monday through Friday because of inclement weather or other conditions beyond the control of the Employer, Friday or Saturday may be worked as a make-up day at straight time (if working 4-10's). Saturday may be worked as a make-up day at straight time (if working 5-8's). An Employer, who is working a four (4) ten (10) hour day work schedule may use Friday as a make-up day when a workday is lost due to a holiday. A workday is to begin at the option of the Employer but not later than 11:00 a.m. except when inclement weather, requirements of the owner or other conditions beyond the reasonable control of the Employer prevent work. Except as worked as a make-up day, time on Saturday shall be worked at one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) times the regular rate. Work performed on Sunday shall be paid at two (2) times the regular rate. Work performed on recognized holidays or days observed as such, shall also be paid at the double (2) time rate of pay. **For all overtime hours worked during the week or on Saturday \$14.55 of the fringe benefits portion of the prevailing wage shall be paid at time and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$).** **For all overtime hours worked on Sundays or recognized holidays \$14.55 of the fringe benefits portion of the prevailing wage shall be paid double time. The remaining \$.50 of the fringe benefit portion of the prevailing wage shall be paid at straight time.**

NO. 29: Means the regularly scheduled work week shall be five (5) consecutive days, Monday through Friday or Tuesday through Saturday. Eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work. Starting time shall not be earlier than 7:00 a.m. nor later than 10:00 a.m. Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work. Overtime at the rate of time and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) will be paid for all work in excess of forty (40) hours in any one work week. On the Monday through Friday schedule, all work performed on Saturday will be time and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) unless time has been lost during the week, in which case Saturday will be a make up day to the extent of the lost time. On the Tuesday through Saturday schedule, all work performed on Monday will be time and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) unless time has been lost during the week, in which case Monday will be a make-up day to the extent of the lost time. Any work performed on Sunday will be double (2) time. If employees work on any of the recognized holidays, they shall be paid time and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) their regular rate of pay for all hours worked.

NO. 31: Means the overtime rate shall be time and one-half the regular rate for work over forty (40) hours per week. Sundays and Holidays shall be paid at double the straight time rate. All employees performing work on affected properties during or following emergencies shall receive the applicable rate of pay for the first sixteen (16) consecutive hours and all hours worked in excess of sixteen (16) consecutive hours shall be paid at double time until broken by an eight (8) hour rest period. Should an employee be called back to work within two hours of his normal quitting time, the previous hours worked shall count toward the above sixteen (16) hour provision.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE – HEAVY CONSTRUCTION**

NO. 3: The following days are recognized as holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If a holiday falls on a Sunday, it shall be observed on the following Monday. No work shall be performed on Labor Day except in case of jeopardy to work under construction. This rule is applied to protect Labor Day. When a holiday falls during the normal work week, Monday through Friday, it shall be counted as eight (8) hours toward the forty (40) hour week; however, no reimbursement for this eight (8) hours is to be paid to the workmen unless worked. An Employer working a four (4) day, ten (10) hour schedule may use Friday as a make up day when an observed holiday occurs during the work week. Employees have the option to work that make up day. If workmen are required to work the above enumerated holidays, or days observed as such, they shall receive time & one-half (1½) the regular rate of pay for such work.

NO. 15: The following days are recognized as holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July Fourth, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If a holiday falls on Sunday, it shall be observed on the following Monday. If a holiday falls on Saturday, it shall be observed on the preceding Friday. No work shall be performed on Labor Day except in case of jeopardy to work under construction. This rule is applied to protect Labor Day. If workmen are required to work the above enumerated holidays or days observed as such, they shall receive time and one-half (1½) the regular rate of pay for such work. Where one of the holidays specified falls or is observed during the workweek, then all work performed over and above thirty-two (32) hours in that week shall be paid at the rate of time and one-half (1½). Workmen shall receive time and one-half (1 ½) for all work performed on Sundays. Double (2) time shall be paid for work on Sunday or recognized holidays when and only if any other craft employees of the same employer at work on that same job site are receiving double (2) time for that Sunday or holiday.

NO. 16: The following days are recognized as holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If a holiday falls on Sunday, it shall be observed on the following Monday. If a holiday falls on Saturday, it shall be observed on the preceding Friday. No work shall be performed on Labor Day except in case of jeopardy to work under construction. This rule is applied to protect Labor Day. When a holiday falls during the normal work week, Monday through Friday, it shall be counted as eight (8) hours toward the forty (40) hour week; however, no reimbursement for this eight (8) hours is to be paid to the worker unless worked. If workers are required to work the above recognized holidays or days observed as such, they shall receive double (2) the regular rate of pay for such work.

NO. 18: All work performed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day shall be paid at the time and one-half (1½) rate of pay. If a holiday falls on Sunday, it shall be observed on the following Monday. If a holiday falls on Saturday, it shall be observed on the preceding Friday. No work shall be performed on Labor Day except in case of jeopardy to work under construction. This rule is applied to protect Labor Day. When a holiday falls during the normal work week, Monday through Friday, it shall be counted as eight (8) hours toward a forty (40) hour week; however no reimbursement for this eight (8) hours is to be paid to the working person(s) unless the holiday is worked.

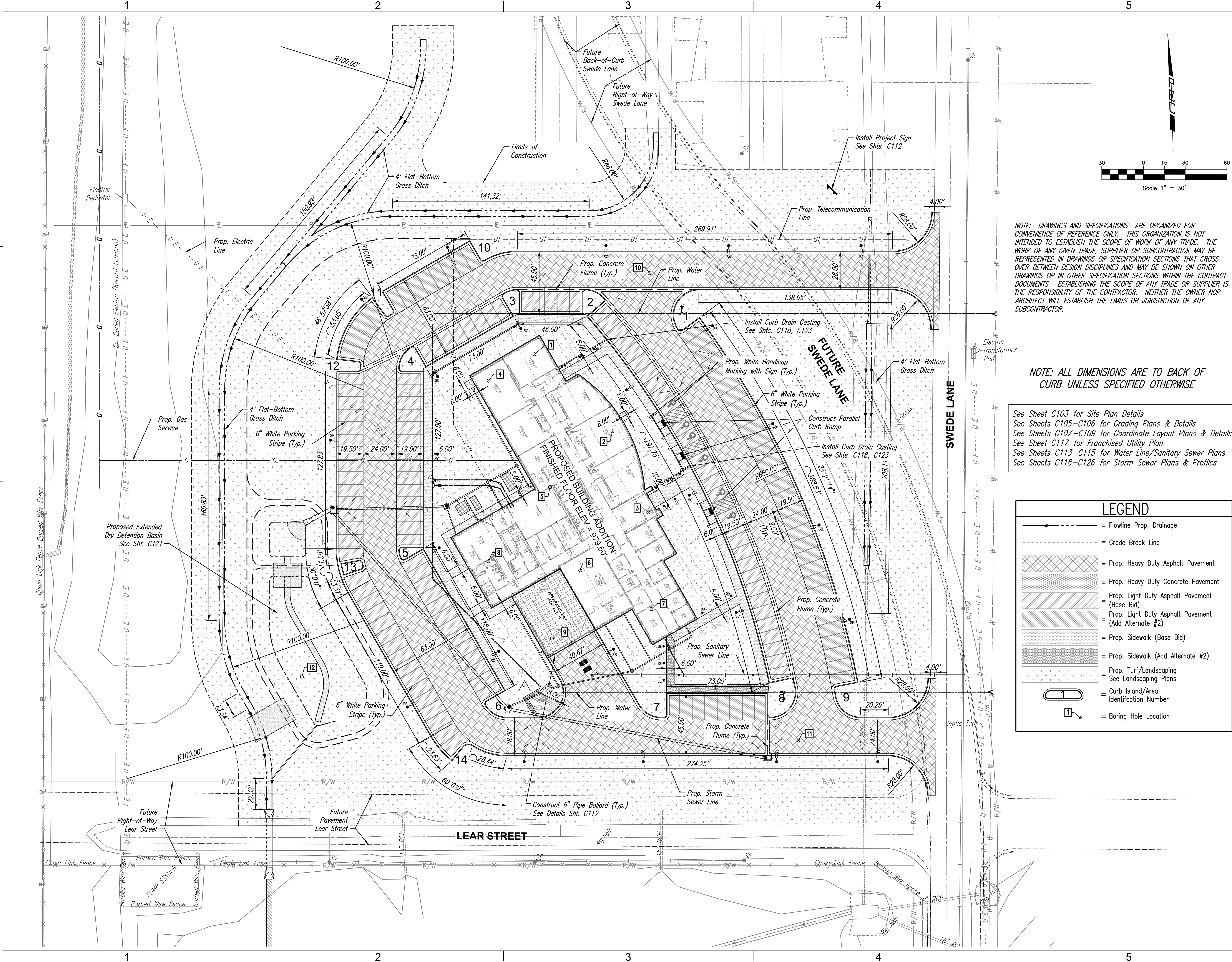
NO. 24: Work performed on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, or days celebrated as such, shall be paid at the double time rate of pay. If the holiday falls on Saturday, it will be observed on Friday; if the holiday falls on Sunday, it will be observed on Monday, and shall be paid for at double (2) the regular straight time rate of pay.

NO. 28: The following days shall be observed as legal holidays: New Year's Day, Decoration Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, Employee's birthday and two (2) personal days. The observance of one (1) of the personal days to be limited to the time between December 1 and March 1 of the following year. If any of these holidays fall on Sunday, the following Monday will be observed as the holiday and if any of these holidays fall on Saturday, the preceding Friday will be observed as the holiday. If employees work on any of these holidays they shall be paid time & one-half (1½) their regular rate of pay for all hours worked.

NO. 30: All work performed on New Year's Day, Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Christmas Day, Thanksgiving Day and Day after Thanksgiving or days celebrated for the same.

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AN ORDINANCE repealing in its entirety, the "Local Vendors" section as set forth in General Provisions, under Subparagraph D., Acceptable Preferences, of the City of Joplin's Purchasing and Procurement Policies and Procedures as adopted by Ordinance No. 99-061, passed on April 19, 1999, and enacting in lieu thereof, a new "Local Vendors – Preference" section, in General Provisions, under Subparagraph D., Acceptable Preferences, of the City of Joplin Purchasing and Procurement Policies and Procedures.

WHEREAS, Section 4.03 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Joplin, Missouri, establishes a division of purchases and requires that rules and regulations pertaining to purchases of the City be enacted; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Joplin requested of the Legal Department, that a study be undertaken and an opinion rendered thereafter, concerning the permissible extent of local preference for procurement of goods and projects for the City of Joplin; and,

WHEREAS, after review and consideration of the information gleaned from the study and the opinion, it is the Council's desire to move forward with the enactment of a local procurement bid policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JOPLIN, MISSOURI, as follows:

Section 1. That the "Local Vendors" section as set forth in General Provisions, under Subparagraph D., Acceptable Preferences, of the City of Joplin's Purchasing and Procurement Policies and Procedures as adopted by Ordinance No. 99-061, passed on April 19, 1999, be repealed in its entirety and that a new "Local Vendors – Preference" section, in General Provisions, under Subparagraph D., Acceptable Preferences, of the City of Joplin Purchasing and Procurement Policies and Procedures, be enacted in lieu thereof, to read as follows:

"GENERAL PROVISIONS

...

D. Acceptable Preferences

...

"Local Vendors - Preference:

1. Preference will be given to vendors or contractors who produce, manufacture, or market goods and/or services within the defined radius as described below, if the quality and price are comparable with all other goods and/or services offered to the City and all other factors to be considered in the bid award process are equal. When a formal written bid or proposal is not required, local vendors may be given an opportunity to match prices offered by non-local vendors, as long as the products are equal as to specification and quality requirements.

2. A vendor or contractor is considered to be local if their principal place of business is located within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from Joplin City Hall, with the majority of its primary business operations, including but not limited to, production, operation, purchasing, billing marketing, management, administration and ownership, occurring within said radius. "Local" shall not include the following:

- (a) Those businesses with only a local post office box; or
- (b) Those businesses with a sales presence in the said radius, but no physical business location within the said radius; or
- (c) Home based businesses that merely take orders for products shipped from out-of-town to their customers.

3. When bids or proposals are received from both local and non-local vendors or contractors, the local bidder may be given preference in the awarding of the bid provided that its bid meets all other specification, quality, and service requirements in the following instances:

- (a) If a local bidder is within three (3%) percent of the lowest bid from a non-local bidder on a bid or proposal from \$3,000.00 up to \$1,000,000.00, and within two (2%) percent on such bid or proposal from \$1,000,000.00 up to \$3,000,000.00, and within one (1%) percent on such bid or proposal from \$3,000,000.00 to \$5,000,000.00.
- (b) The local purchasing preference policy shall not apply in the following instances:
 - 1. When purchases and or contracts are funded in whole or in part by federal funds:
 - 2. When such preference is in conflict with any applicable state or federal laws, rules or regulations.
 - 3. When construction projects are financed with public assistance, including but not limited to, tax increment financing, Chapter 100 bonds, Chapter 353 redevelopment projects and enterprise zone redevelopment.
- (c) In the event that a general/prime contractor wishes a bid to be considered local, such contractor must either be local as defined above and at least 51% of the value of the total work to be performed as set forth in the bid price must be accomplished by the general/prime contractor or subcontractors considered local pursuant to this policy as

defined above; or, utilize subcontractors considered local who will perform at least sixty percent (60%) of the value of the total work to be performed as set forth in the bid. The general/prime contractor will be required to document this information and provide it with the bid in order for the bid to be considered under the local vendor preference policy."

1. The prebid meeting was held at the Joplin Regional Airport in the old terminal building. The meeting began at 10:30 a.m. A site visit followed the meeting.
2. Ryan Kremer reviewed information in the "Notice to Contractors" section within the Project Manual including the following:
 - a. Bidding Documents may be obtained by contacting Ryan Kremer and Nicolas Bosman with GLMV Architecture, Inc. Contact information is included in the "Notice to Contractor's" section of the Project Manual.
 - b. No oral interpretations to questions may be relied upon. Questions must be submitted in writing to Ryan Kremer and Nicolas Bosman with GLMV Architecture, Inc. within five business days prior to the Bid opening date. Interpretations will be addressed by Addendum only. Addenda become part of the Contract Documents.

3. Bid Date and Time is March 24, 2016, at 11:00 a.m. Bids will be read publicly on March 24, 2016 at 11:30 a.m.
4. Bidders must submit a subcontractor list in accordance with the requirements in the Project Manual within 24 hours of the Bid Date and Time. The deadline to submit the subcontractor list is March 25, 2016, at 11:00 a.m. Failure to submit the subcontractor list within the timeframe stipulated will result in rejection of the Bid.
5. The Contract will be a Stipulated Sum. The Contract will be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible Bidder.
6. Substantial Completion of the Project must be achieved within 304 consecutive calendar days.
7. Ryan Kremer described the Summary of the Work, including approximate square footage and use of the building as well as the approximate size and features of the site.
8. Attendees were directed to refer to Sheet C101 which includes direction regarding existing buried utilities across the site. Contractor shall contact utility companies to confirm abandonment of buried utilities prior to excavation on the site.
9. Contractor shall be cognizant of any and all FAA regulations that may exist (such as an FAA crane permit) due to the Project site's proximity to the airport. James Furgerson added that the training tower to the south of the Project site required a crane permit while it was under construction, thus it is likely this Project will require one.
10. Access to the Project site will be off of Swede Lane. Nicholas Heatherly noted that Swede Lane was constructed after the tornado and was not built to standards, and thus may not hold up to excessive heavy traffic. Contractor should try to control access and protect the edges of the road. Contractor will be responsible for making repairs of damage to existing roads caused by construction activities.
11. Contractor's staging areas are shown on C105. These are the only areas dedicated to Contractor use. Nicholas Heatherly noted that the Project site is surrounded by open ground and that this space may not be used by the Contractor for staging or other activities or uses.
12. Contractor to be pay close attention to scope of work to be included in the Base bid and Add Alternate work called out on the drawings.
13. A question was asked whether there were Minority-Owned Company (MBE) or Minority- and Woman-Owned Company (MWBE) hiring requirements. Nicholas Heatherly responded that there are no subcontracting requirements for these types of enterprises. The Project Manual does ensure that disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.
14. A question was asked whether there is a preference to local Contractors for this project. The response given at the Prebid meeting is not correct. Preference, will be given to vendors or contractors according to "*Council Bill No. 2008-020.*"
15. A question was asked about the budget of the Project. The approximate construction cost is expected to be between \$3.5 and 6 million, depending on a number of factors including Base Bid and Alternate Bid construction.
16. A question was asked about the approximate date for the start of construction. Nick described a timeline and sequence of events that will occur and approximated May 1, 2016 as the earliest date for a Notice to Proceed.
